Mitzi Chang

Chang is one of the go-to lawyers for blockchain and cryptocurrency companies as well as their potential investors. As co-chair of the digital currency and blockchain technology practice at Goodwin Procter LLP, she is often sought for her guidance on key regulatory and transactional issues.

Before joining Goodwin Procter, she was in-house counsel for CBS Interactive Inc., a role she says helped her gain insight on how to add value to her technology clients.

Phunware Inc., an enterprise cloud platform, relied on her counsel in the launch of a \$100 million offering by its subsidiary PhunCoin.

One her favorite aspects of her job is assisting clients with the challenges they are facing.

"A lot of times [clients are] calling you because they really need your help," she said. "They don't know where to go, or maybe they have an idea, but it's enough where it's a big issue where they want your advice."

"So for me, it's really that interaction that I've always enjoyed," she added.
